Did you ever wonder where we get the topics and Scripture readings for our Worship services each week? Some pastors are very good at Topical Preaching, where you select topics and find appropriate Scripture readings to support the topics. Others use what is called a Common Lectionary where Scripture is chosen for every Sunday of the Church year. The common lectionary provides a complete cycle of Scripture readings from the Synoptic Gospels - Matthew, Mark, and Luke. And they fill in appropriate readings from the Gospel of John. Also, the Old Testament readings and the Psalms and the Epistle readings tie together with the Gospel reading.

By following this schedule, the Word of God is the topic, and the Pastor finds the topic for the Sermon from the Bible as it is presented to us.

The Church year, starting with the season of Advent allows us to read and study the seasons of the year with the highlights of special services such as Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Ascension of Jesus ending with All Saints day, and Christ the King Sunday.

A Remnant

"Listen to me, you who pursue righteousness and who seek the Lord: Look to the rock from which you were cut and to the quarry from which you were hewn." Isaiah 51:1 (NIV) A faithful remnant in Israel are encouraged to remember their past, and the power of God that created a great nation from a single couple, an old man and a woman past their age of bearing children.

"And the surviving remnant of the house of Judah shall again take root downward and bear fruit upward. For out of Jerusalem shall go a remnant, and out of Mount Zion a band of survivors. The zeal of the Lord will do this." 2 Kings 19:30-31 (ESV) God was assuring King Hezakiah that a remnant would survive the Assyrian invasion.

There are numerous examples throughout the Bible of God saving a small remnant of faithful people to carry on, and, as in the case of His message to Hezakiah, "again take root downward and bear fruit upward."

A pastor once told me that the Lutheran seminary trains and equips pastors to "Preach the Word and administer the sacraments." Of course, we know the pastoral duties of parish ministry entail much more than this, but it points to the centrality of scripture and the daily working of God in our lives. Please read Pastor Ron Dahle's lead article in this newsletter about using the common lectionary in Sunday worship where "the Word of God is

I also encourage you to read the Preamble to Charity's constitution, along

with Article II (you can find the link at the bottom of our web page in the middle column). Both areas confess faith in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, as well as point to the scriptural authority for everything Charity is called to do, as the "only infallible authority in all matters of faith and life." The Word is the "rock from which you were cut and the quarry from which you were hewn" here at Charty.

With that, all adults are invited to join us this fall using the Bible as our textbook on Wednesday evenings at 6:15, with the Bethel Bible Series, first providing an overview of the Old Testament before moving on to an overview of the New Testament. The Bethel Bible Series mission is to "Lead church members into a disciplined study of Scripture in such a way that they encounter the Living Christ."

When first introduced, WOW, (Worship on Wednesday) was intended to be an intergenerational night for whole families, starting with a family meal, then children's and youth programming, along with adult group studies. We'll be reintroducing the concept with a bit of a twist as WOW (Word on Wednesday), including a fun scripture memorization program for the elementary ages.

Charity's Adult Ed will continue in the sanctuary this fall on Sunday mornings at 10:45 following the service, running concurrently with the children's Sunday School hour.

Vision Council Update

Greetings from the Vision Council. It has been a great summer but as usual it is flying by. It has been nice to see the countryside staying so green with the rain this year.

With Doug Sprynczynatyk and Nathaniel Oakland leaving their staff positions at the end of June, there have been meetings to organize volunteer teams to fill the gap in the facility/grounds and the children's and youth areas, to continue reducing Charity's monthly expenses. If you could help in any of those areas, please contact Doug Leet.

The Vision Council also approved a new Prayer Chain policy. There had been questions about how the Prayer Chain was being administered and who was eligible to receive prayer requests. A copy is available by contacting the office.

If you have been reading Charity Lutheran's monthly newsletter you are aware that our monthly income is still falling well short of expenses. Income has fallen significantly with the splitting of Charity in 2022 without an equivalent reduction in expenses. Fortunately, Charity has had a healthy reserve fund, but good stewardship requires income and expenses to be brought into balance sooner rather than later. Staff have been working diligently to reduce expenses where they can, but the single largest expense is the staff payroll. Some difficult decisions are going to have to be made in the next several months to achieve the goal of a balanced budget. There will be further detailed communications on this subject, and we intend to schedule an informational meeting in late August or early September.

As difficult as the challenges are before us, the leadership team is united in the belief that Charity is only growing stronger in faith and trust in our Father's will for us. We continue to lean on God through the Holy Spirit for wisdom, guidance, and council. Our God will see us through this next transition at Charity. Please pray for all the Charity staff and leadership teams. I also encourage everyone to join us in corporate prayer each Tuesday evening at 6:30.

Tartu Mission Trip

Greetings, Charity Friends of Tartu Academy in Estonia

Since 2006 Charity has been a faithful supporter of Tartu Academy of Theology in Tartu, Estonia. Over the years you have given much for the ministry and training of pastors and church workers through TAT, and on several occasions you have hosted both Pastor Eenok Haamer (Founder of TAT), and his son, Pastor Siimon Haamer (Dean, TAT), when they have visited at Charity. The duration of your faithful friendship and support over 17 years has been so very much appreciated!

Soon in August, four members of Charity will be joining me and four others from Minnesota, Colorado, and Nebraska on a short-term mission trip to Estonia, the first since the pandemic outbreak in 2019. Donavon Hatzenbuhler, Kathy Wermager, and Arlan and Linda Okerson will be representing Charity August 9-19, and are currently in the process of raising funds for their ground expenses in Estonia. In the transitional process at Charity some things got a bit lost in the shuffle. Airfares have been secured, but the needs on the ground are about \$2000 for each (or a total of \$8000). On this short notice, we pray it will be possible for the Charity family to bring this additional support to the servants of Charity.

I hope you will take time to visit the Estonia table in the Fellowship Hall, locate the friends who will be traveling in August, and ask them some questions. Your prayers are going to be the primary request from them, but your prayerful gifts will also be so gratefully received! You can look for regular daily reports coming during their travels and through the Adult Bible Camp days in TAT. When they return you will hear how God has used this event once again for His glory, both in Estonia and in the lives of each missionary servant!


