Seasons of transition, whether in life or in an organization like Charity, can be overwhelming and even kind of scary. As council president Mike Fluharty mentions in his newsletter article this month, with Pastor Brad finishing up his time at Charity, a short-term preaching schedule is in place, mostly with Pastor Ron Dahle in July and August (see Pastor Ron's article too). There are a couple of exceptions in July, with Liberian missionary Samar Ghandour visiting on July 9, and Pastors Kathy and Peter Braafladt visiting on July 16. Charity continues to move forward. We "Rejoice in the Lord always," as we continue looking to the Lord in prayer with thanksgiving. We can trust that God will lead, and that He will provide.

You can see in the accompanying financial chart that Charity is not currently, as Pastor Brad stated in a recent sermon, "functioning at scale." In May, Charity's general fund income fell more than \$10,000 short of expenditures, and yearto-date income is more than \$43,000 behind expenditures. As Charity moves forward, we will increasingly rely more on volunteers than on paid staff for different areas of need with our facility and grounds and with church programming. We ask that you pray about how you can continue to support Charity, both financially and in volunteer service.

With that, there are two part-time staff members who are leaving their positions at the end of June: Doug Sprynczynatyk (Spry) and Nathaniel Oakland. Spry is nearing retirement, but has accepted a similar custodial position with St. Mary's Catholic Parish. It's an opportunity that presented itself, and one that he's looking forward to. Nathaniel was initially hired as Charity's Connections Coordinator, but quickly stepped up when vacancies and needs developed in the children's and youth areas this past year. As the school year neared completion, Nathaniel decided to step back from his involvement in those areas and had been immersing himself in home and family obligations, along with the myriad and time-consuming kids' activities that entails. Nathaniel and his family continue to be a part of Charity, and he looks forward to volunteering in areas of need.

Vision Council Update

Greetings from the Vision Council.

I hope your summer is going well. I have certainly enjoyed the rain we have received in June. It is always nice to see the countryside green and growing. Not that long ago I was sure winter would never end and now we are well into summer. The seasons just keep rolling along. Our season is changing at Charity also. By the time this is printed our time with Pastor Brad will have ended and what a time it was. It was a time of trials and many challenges. Some pain and sorrow but a lot of growth as a church too. Perhaps not in numbers but in spiritual growth. We have grown in our understanding of Lutheran doctrine, the inerrant Word of God, and why it is so important to follow our governing documents. As difficult as the last year has been, we owe much thanks to Pastor Brad's teaching and guidance through it all. God's calling him to Charity Lutheran has been a great blessing to us all. Thank you, Pastor Brad. We will miss you and keep your next interim call in our prayers.

At the June Vision Council meeting we reviewed a number of options to fill the Pastoral vacancy as the Call Committee continues their work. We have determined that our best course forward will be to find another full-time Interim Pastor. That search process has been started. In the short-term Pastor Ron Dahle has graciously agreed to serve in a preaching capacity for July and August.

We have been attempting to hire both a Youth Director and Worship Leader with no success. We are now combining those two positions into one full-time position. Depending on potential candidate qualifications, the position would be "Associate Pastor of Worship and Youth" (LCMC qualified Pastor) or "Pastoral Associate for Worship and Youth." We hope that a full-time position will broaden the candidate pool.

I will close with a big "Thank You!" to all the volunteers and organizers of the Vacation Bible School in June. I have received a lot of positive feedback about the turnout, content, and enthusiastic response from the kids. Thank you to all of you that put so much time and effort into it.



A Little About Me

Pastor Ron Dahle

I have been asked to do some preaching during the period of time between the time of the leaving of Pastor Miller, and the calling of your next called or interim Pastor.

Perhaps it might be good for you to know a little about me. I am a graduate of Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. I have served parishes in North Dakota since 1995. I retired about 5 years ago, but have worked as an interim pastor in some western North Dakota AFLC (Association of Free Lutheran Congregations) congregations during that time. Now that work has finished, and I am available to serve in a preaching capacity at Charity Lutheran.

It is my intention to follow the common lectionary rather than a topical style of preaching. The advantage is that we get to work our way through the Gospels in an orderly way. The Gospel message is the only function of preaching, and we must seek what God has to say to us from His written Word.


One perspective I wish all of us to consider is 'why is it necessary to hear the Gospel.' I like to use the first three chapters of Genesis to set the conditions for hearing the good news of the Gospel of Jesus, the Christ. God intended everything to be good, and to be in full harmony (relationship) between creation and God. But in Chapter 3 we find the rebellion of our first parents, and the result of every generation since then as being born alienated from God. And by default, rebellious!

God has given us the only plan for reconciling the world to God through faith in Jesus, the one sent from God, who is also God, to do the work necessary for us to be restored into full relationship with God. This is done through the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus.

From this comes the gift of the Holy Spirit who works faith in us when we hear the proclamation of the Gospel. I hope and pray to present the Gospel from this perspective. I pray that it will be a blessing to us all. Pray that the Holy Spirit would guide and direct our worship.

I look forward to sharing the Gospel with you and getting to know you.


