Intentional Interim Senior Pastor Brad Miller From the Pastor

We have a rare challenge in seeking the next Senior Pastor for Charity. First, Charity really is a unique cross-cultural faith hybrid. Describing that hybrid accurately - without scaring away most candidates - is one challenge. Second, the narrative that is beginning to circulate within the LCMC will be most unhelpful to us. We need to create positive impressions among our candidate pool by shaping the perceptions about Charity. A mere Public Relations campaign would be futile. We need to accomplish things that reestablish Charity as a missional leader:

The Ukraine Mission Trip will be mid- The Conference on Evangelism will December. We are inviting the participation (funding, prayers, colored Christmas cards to deliver) of every LCMC and NALC church in the USA and Canada. The trip will go into Ukraine if possible, but if not would minister in refugee camps near the border. We would distribute food aid in the camps and Christmas cards that are hand decorated. We would distribute challenge coins and prayer cards to the military. This would follow the successful model that was used in Irag with ISIS refugees and NPU soldiers.

be in January. It will focus on the intersection of pragmatic evangelism tools (like metrics) and the very real but more abstract guidance of the Holy Spirit. The target audience will be pastors and church leaders passionate about the overlap of these topics. We will have fun with: "you've always wanted an excuse to visit ND in January." We will offer time and space for a meeting to restart the Evangelical Renewal District – if sufficient interest exists.

Evangelism in "Missions"

On a recent Sunday in October, Charity Lutheran was blessed to host a couple of mission organizations that we've supported over the years. We heard from the Overseas Council, with El Ahlwardt and Josue Fernandez, their new executive director, and we also heard from Pastor Bob Nordvall, representing the Tartu Academy of Theology in Estonia. Both organizations are raising up future Christian pastors and ministry leaders and workers, and we are thankful that a new connection has been made between the two organizations.

Evangelism is simply spreading and preaching the good news of the Gospel. Charity has supported local and global evangelism to a great extent for a most of its existence. In the preamble to Charity's constitution, there are eight areas that our congregation is called to, and two of them speak specifically to evangelism:

- 1. **Proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ** - referencing Matthew 28:19-20, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
- 2. Witness to the community, nation, and world -

referencing 2 Timothy 2:15, "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth." As a faith family, we at Charity Lutheran will continue to build on its calling "to the community, nation, and world" by witnessing outside the walls of our building on north Washington Street.

In upcoming newsletters, we will also explore how Charity can build on its calling to be that "shelter in Christ, transforming lives" inside and outside the walls of that same building. There are six other areas that are mentioned in the preamble to the constitution that we will cover in upcoming newsletters that will provide a solid foundation and focus for this congregation as we continue to move forward in our transition to calling the next senior pastor.

Please pray about your role in this faith family we call Charity, and how you can become involved to a greater extent over the next weeks and months. In regards to evangelism, whether it's by helping to aid those that are suffering in the Ukraine, by volunteering to put on a conference on evangelism at Charity towards the beginning of the year, or by considering being a part of a mission trip to Israel in the spring. And there will be different ways in other areas too, for all of us to pitch in and serve as we work to "spread the good news of the Gospel" and be that "shelter in Christ, transforming lives."

Ukraine Mission Trip

The humanitarian needs in and near Ukraine right now are vast. Charity is preparing to respond using the model that Pastor Miller refined while working in Iraq in the midst of the ISIS occupation of Mosul. Because the situation in Ukraine is under constant change, some of these details will likely change or be adapted:



- Christmas Trip Christmas is a hard time to be in a refugee camp far away from home. Hence, the weeks before Christmas are an excellent time to visit and bring the encouragement of the Good News alongside of practical humanitarian relief.
- Christmas Cards We will hand-deliver Christmas Cards that are printed in the local language with the Christmas story from St. Luke, but are hand decorated with crayons or colored pencils.
- Direct Aid We want to collect as many funds as possible to use primarily for delivering additional food assistance to refugees in the weeks just before Christmas. We all know how important traditional foods are in our household family traditions. Imagine being far away from your kitchen, your recipes, and your job (that pays for those special ingredients). Just a little extra protein or special holiday bread can be incredibly meaningful to families that have been displaced by war.
- Military Challenge Coins We want to give the encouragement of Holy Scripture to those who are in the fight to save their country. We will create and distribute custom coins featuring the Full Armor of God from Ephesians 6, plus prayer cards in two languages.

Sent by God, Just for Me

T was 26, newly divorced, living far away from family and friends, and dealing with a lot of guilt, shame, and low self-esteem. Was I a total failure? Would anybody ever want me? Was God condemning me because of my divorce?

I found a new church and made some friends, but still struggled. It seemed like all my church friends were perfect, happy, and full of faith—while I was flawed, gloomy, and full of doubts.

When I shared some of this with my pastor, he suggested a Stephen Minister.

Before I met my Stephen Minister, I was worried she would judge and reject me once she learned about my past and got to know the real me. But she didn't. She was patient, loving, and accepting. I truly believe she was sent by God just for me.

We got together weekly. She'd ask me questions, get me talking, and then listen as I shared my struggles and doubts. She showed me God's love even when I didn't feel it. Over time, her faithful care helped me to see that perhaps I wasn't such a terrible person after all. Through her loving care, I began to think that if God loved me, then maybe I could love myself too.

After a while, I got to a better place emotionally, and our Stephen Ministry relationship ended. A few years later, I remarried and had a miscarriage, and she was there for me again as a Stephen Minister, providing the care and support I needed. We now live over a thousand miles apart but she will always hold a special place in my heart.



If you're dealing with any kind of difficulty, if you're struggling with faith questions or doubts, if you're wondering whether you are a worthy person, then I encourage you to consider getting a Stephen Minister.

It just might be that God already has a special one picked out just for you.


