## How about giving thanks where it belongs?

Philippians 4:6 Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

I don't know about you, but there are many times in my life that I have let things – even good things – take my mind away from what actually is the most important thing above all! That is, giving thanks to God for all the blessings that come my way – that I tend to take for granted! Can you relate to this?

This is not to say that there are not adverse things that happen in life.

We must not overlook things that come our way that are just beyond our understanding! Why... comes to mind. Why, Lord, did this have to come my way?? That is normal for us, but we have to realize that God looks at both our spiritual lives, as well as, our physical lives. First and foremost, God has provided everything that we need spiritually. There is nothing left out. God gives us, who believe in Jesus, the gift of faith in Jesus through the Holy Spirit. Look at Ephesians 2:8-9.

This Holy Spirit of God is given to us, and for us, as a gift from God. We are called by the Gospel of Jesus, and the Spirit has the ability to soften the most stubborn heart, to believe in Jesus, through this proclamation. At that point, we are given the gifts to serve. Good works, done in God's name are a natural outcome of faith in Jesus. Our belief in God will change our perspectives in this life. We are no longer identified by circumstances in this life, but by faith in God.

Now, we are ready to understand what Paul writes to the Philippians – "Do not worry about anything..." The gift that comes is Peace. Not just any old peace, but the Peace of God!

## Executive Director of Ministries Doug Leet Back to the Future

1 Thessalonians 5:21 (NASB) But examine everything *carefully*; hold fast to that which is good."

By the time you receive Charity's November newsletter, Reformation Sunday will be behind us. As Charity continues to move forward, we need to be forward looking too, and not so much looking backwards. Although that doesn't always need to be the case.

G.K. Chesterton referred to tradition as being "the democracy of the dead." He wrote, "Tradition means giving votes to the most obscure of all classes, our ancestors. It is the democracy of the dead." Russel Kirk explains this more in his book, "The Shoulders of Giants," "In deciding any important moral or political question, Chesterton writes, we have the obligation to consult the considered opinions of the wise men who have preceded us in time. We owe these dead an immense debt, and their ballots deserve to be counted. Thus, we have no right simply to decide any guestion by what the momentary advantage may be to us privately: we have the duty of respecting the wisdom of our ancestors; and also we have the duty of respecting the rights of posterity, the generations that are to come after us."

One more quote, "Tradition is the living faith of the dead, traditionalism is the dead faith of the living." Jaroslav Pelikan So, what does this have to do with Charity? There are things and events that have been valued in the past that are worth holding on to, and in some cases resurrecting. On Reformation Sunday, the Reformation



As the newest member of the ND Lutherans for Life Exec. Committee, I want to thank Charity Lutheran for the leadership it has shown in faithfully bearing witness to the sanctity of life in years past. Charity has been an example for other churches to follow. I also want to invite you to help re-launch the BisMan chapter of LFL at a planning meeting on Thursday, Nov. 2, 6:30-8:00 p.m., at Bethel Lutheran. Youth and adults are invited.


On Friday, Oct. 6, three members from Charity joined with other local Lutherans for the 2023 North Dakota March for Life. After Matins worship at Zion Lutheran, about 30 children and adults walked to the ND State Capitol, where we joined hundreds who marched from the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit. Together we testified to the sanctify of all life.

In effect, the March for Life served as a kick-off for LFL in Bismarck. In the coming months, a number of LFL projects will roll out, including an invite to Bismarck-area youth to join in a book production/social media campaign called "The Yopp Project" (a title that comes from the Dr. Seuss Classic, "Horton Hears a Who," with its famous refrain, "A person's a person no matter how small.").

From mini-research projects, to fictional short stories, to writing and illustrating a short children's book, all published together in a single volume, our youth will be a pro-life voice. Students will also generate social media videos, songs, or otherwise speak a pro-life message via TikTok, Instagram, or their preferred social media platform. "The Yopp Project" will launch March 25, the Annunciation, when we remember that Jesus was conceived in Mary by the Holy Spirit, working through God's word, spoken by the angel Gabriel.

Thank you, Charity, from LFL for your service. I hope you can join us Nov. 2, 6:30 p.m. at Bethel Lutheran Church on 615 E Turnpike Ave in Bismarck.

Congregations carry out Christ's commandment to "Love one another as I have loved you" <u>(John</u> <u>15:12 RSV)</u> in a powerful and practical way.


Pastors have a team of gifted, trained, and committed lay caregivers ready to minister to hurting people.
